Facet	Description	Evidence
Can Explain	Have knowledge of why and how via applicable theories, ideas, and/or illustrations	 Via generalizations or principles, provide justified and systematic accounts of phenomena, facts, and data Make insightful connections and provide illuminating examples or illustrations
Can Interpret	Translate knowledge to narratives that provide meaning	 Tell meaningful stories Offer apt translations Provide a revealing historical or personal dimension to ideas and events Make the object of understanding personal or accessible through images, anecdotes, analogies, and models
Can Apply	Match knowledge to context to use it effectively in new and diverse situations	 Effectively use and adapt what is known in diverse and real contexts Can "do" the subject/topic/area of focus
Have Perspective	Critically interpret assumptions, conclusions, implications, and points of view	See and hear points of view through critical eyes and earsSee the big picture
Can Empathize	Have insight into the feelings and worldviews of others	 Find value in what others might find odd, alien, or implausible Perceive sensitively on the basis of prior direct experience
Have Self-Knowledge	Identify personal ignorance and how patterns of thought and action inform or lead to prejudice	 Show metacognitive awareness Perceive the personal style, prejudices, projections, and habits of mind that both shape and impede your own understanding Are aware of what is not understood Reflect on the meaning of learning and experience
